

A Project Lead's Guide to Flooring Offcut Recycling

What is ResiLoop?

ResiLoop captures clean resilient flooring installation offcuts and diverts them from landfill to recycling through a network of registered Collection Points.

Participating can reduce waste disposal costs.

What's collected (in-scope)

- Homogeneous vinyl sheet
- Heterogeneous vinyl sheet
- LVT

How it works

1. Project is flagged early via [notification form](#) by your team, the product supplier or the flooring contractor so ResiLoop can confirm scope, timing and contractor details.
2. ResiLoop onboards the Flooring Contractor's depot as a Collection Point (free).
3. ResiLoop supplies free collection bags (HO/HE/LVT) + a ResiLoop bin to the depot (not to project site).
4. Floor layers bag offcuts on site and return bags to the Contractor's depot for consolidation.
5. The flooring contractor books free pickups via the ResiLoop app.

Your Checklist

- Make it clear that your project preference is for all flooring contractors to be registered with ResiLoop or similar take-back programs so in-scope offcuts can be sent for recycling.
- Set the expectation that no in-scope offcuts go in the general skip bins on site.
- Reinforce that the standard approach is return to depot (site collection only if agreed in advance).
- If you want material tracking/reporting, note that this can be done via the ResiLoop App – ask the flooring contractor to log/track the offcut collections in the App for this to occur.
- Ensure the flooring contractor briefs floor layers on exactly which products/areas are in-scope on this project. Use our On-site Instructions form to communicate this clearly.
